


TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK





By Road: The park is 121 kms through a tarmac road from Arusha city to the main gate.

Climate

Tarangire has a bimodal rainfall with short rains from October to December, long rains from March to May and dry season from June to October and January to February. The highest day temprature goes up to 38°C in January to February but drops to 15°C in July.



Attractions

Wildlife

Tarangire is noted as a safari destination for its large concrentration of wildlife population. There are unimagenable herds of animals that are attracted to the Tarangire river. Most notable animals are Elephants, Eland, Giraffe, Lions, Buffalo, Cheatah, Leopards and Zebras.

The park also gives you a chance to see Mongoose Colonies that are often hosted by abonded ant hill. Endeavour to make this Park part of your safari in nothern Tanzania

The best place to see the gentle Giants in their natural habitat from the adorable calves all the way to the intimidating bulls. Come see them digging up the muddy river trying to access water!!!!

Baobab Trees

If only they could talk, the baobab trees certainly have no hurry !!!! and why should they be!! .As they have all the time in the world! They can live up to 3000 years and can grow trunks reaching more than 100 feet in circumference. They have spent quite sometime on the planet and seen a lot of history. So, if only they could talk, they would surely be interesting storytellers!



The river is fed by seasonal sand rivers originating to the East and South-eastern parts of the park. It flows northward along the park and empties into Lake Burunge. Within the park, the river is linked to/with Silale, Gurusi and Larmakau swamps. It is undoubtedly that Tarangire River with its associated permanent swamps serves as critical dry season water sources for thousands of migratory animals in dry seasons, thus offering a fantastic game drive experience.

Bird Life

Enjoy spotting a large batch of colourful and exclusive bird species. Over 550 different species of which several are threatened or endemic are housed with terrestrial and aquatic environments, spread all over across the park. Particularly rich bird life occurs in the open Acacia woodlands, in and along the wetlands and in the floodplain of Tarangire River. The park is therefore an amazing destination for bird lovers. One wouldn't miss to see colourful and breeding species of birds such as African bishop, Secretary bird, Open-billed stork, Spoon bill and Crown crane.



Termite Mounds

The mounds built of soil from underground and held together by termite saliva are always seen and provide observation points for animals. They are also a home to dwarf mongoose, pangolin, snakes, ardvark when abandoned.




Tourism Activities

Game Drive

This is an adventure that entails viewing wildlife while in a car. Tarangire offers tourists an opportunity to explore Mammals such large herds of Elephants, Giraffes, fringe eared Oryx, Greater Kudu, Gazelles, Hartebeest, Wildebeest, Lions, Leopards, and Zebras. Birds including Ostriches, Tiny Ashy Starling, Guinea fowls, Francolins. Reptiles like Tree Climbing Pythons, Tortois.

They mostly take place in early morning, late afternoon or evening because animals are more active during cooler times of the day. A game drive ensures a unique and thrilling safari experience. One can enjoy the natural dramas of the animals, exciting actions and predators' hunting.

This gives you a more learning experience about animals in the wilderness and a better way of spotting animals at a close range. It is mostly done in the morning and evenings and brings about a different scope and sense of adventure. It also conveys a different dimension in the whole safari experience.

Hot air balloon flight in Tarangire will give you a different experience. Gliding across Tarangire river on your tour as the sunrise stains the plains pink, the golden grassland dotted with giant baobab trees, the silver ribbons of the Tarangire River and animals congregate in their hundreds in the early morning; make you be part of the natural world.





Bird Diversity

Tarangire is a great bird watching site with more than 500 species recorded. Bird lovers should keep an eye open for flocks of dazzlingly colorful yellow-collared lovebird and the somewhat drabber rufous-tailed weaver and ashy starling.

Night Game Drive

The bush is completely a different world at night. This is what makes night drives so special. Not only do night game drives allow you to see nocturnal animals but also are a fantastic way to see nocturnal predators such as leopards.

Night drives are interesting and can offer a different perspective on wildlife. The smaller cats, genet and African wild cat not to mention the chance of seeing lion hunting. Night jars and other birds are also of interest.

Going with a blanket sitting in an open vehicle under an African sky with the pretty stars is a moment to remember.

Where to stay

There is wide choice of accommodation facilities in and outside tarangire national park.

Tarangire is well supplied with public, private facilities ncludes, permanent, seasonal camps and permanent lodge both locsted withn and outside the park. The park also owns a well furnished rest huose, Bandas and a student hostel.

V. Multiple entry in the park

High school students

There shall be two multiple entries in the Park where entry fees shall apply

- i. Day-trip permit, which is valid for twelve daylight hours and allows multiple entries within such validity period.
- ii. A sleep-over permit which is valid for twenty-four hours and allows multiple entries within such validity period.

- Conservation and Vehicle fees are for multiple entry
- Fee once paid is non- refundable
- Proof of identification is mandatory at entry gate
- All tariffs are VAT (18%) exclusive
- Expatriates/residents and their dependents living in Tanzania must have either of the following documents: residents permit Class A,B or C; exemption certificate; temporary pass attached with
- Government receipt plus acknowledgement letter; and Diplomatic passport or ID
- EAC citizen refers to the nationals of Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Burundi, Rwanda and South Sudan
- Nationals of other EAC member states must produce their passport at entry gate
- EAC private vehicles are strictly prohibited to conduct any tourism business in the park
