By being close to nature, a chance to see a typical grassland area of truly African Savannah is maximized.

Brief History of the Park

Established on 9th July 2019, the Park covers an area of 4,707 sq. km and traces its origin back to 1970 where it acquired the status of a National Game Reserve covering Kimisi, Biharamulo and Burigi itself. It lies in two regions of Kagera and Geita in the districts of Ngara, Karagwe, Biharamulo, Muleba and Chato respectively.

Getting there

The park can be reached by both air and road. By air is through Chato International Airport located in Chato district before connecting to the park through road transport to the nearby Kijuu gate at Katete just 40km off the airport. Upon proper arrangement by tour operators prior to visit, the scheduled flights and private charters can bring you into the park through Nkonje airstrip which is located at Nkonje tourist circuit. Other nearby airports/airstrips include; Biharamulo airstrip and Bukoba airport. The park is also connected to the neighboring countries of Rwanda, Burundi and Uganda through the Rusumo, Manyovu and Mutukula borders respectively. Visitors from DRC, Rwanda and

Burundi are advised to use the Nyungwe entry gate whereas for those who come from Uganda can use the Ruhita and Kijuu gates. Visitors from within the country but far from Kagera region can use Nyungwe and Kijuu gates where as those coming from Kagera region can use any of the three gates depending on the districts they come from.

Climate

Two rainfall seasons, short rains which begin in November to December and long rains from March to April. The dry weather starts from June to September and are characterized with average temperatures cool nights and warm days. The best time to visit the park is June-October and January to March.

Attractions

One of the world's largest antelope, the statuesque cape eland (Taulotragus Oryx) is found in this Park. The park also encompasses a number of different bird species including migratory (palearctic and afro tropical migrants) and birds native to the area i.e. the local migrants and few individuals of the rare bizarre shoebill stork without forgetting the most notably African fish eagles.





Other animals include the Elephants, Lions, Buffaloes, Roan antelopes, Impala, Leopards, Zebra, Giraffes, Spotted hyaena, Sitatunga, Oribi, Topi, Reedbuck, Bushbucks, Dikdik and Waterbucks.

The park environment is beautified by open grassland vegetation, with mixed forests, some bushlands, acacia woodland vegetation forming habitat for giraffes, the evergreen Miombo woodland where most monkey species, leopards and other animals spend their time. One can also feel the scenic beauty of five lakes, round topped hills and at some points the wetlands which save as refuge for all wildlife during dry season.





The Kagera River at the far west adds up to park beauty and form the boundary with the neighboring country of Rwanda.

The animals in this park together with the scenic beauty of the surrounding makes the park more exciting.

Game Drive

The most spectacular activity that makes you close to nature





Walking safari

Both short and long walks up round hills enable you to see animals at the closer distance and make wildlife photographs of your choice.

Bird watching

With an aid of qualified guides one can conduct a birding safari and enjoy a variety of bird species present in the park.



- Conservation and Vehicle fees are for multiple entry
- Fee once paid is non- refundable
- Proof of identification is mandatory at entry gate
- All tariffs are VAT (18%) exclusive
- Expatriates/residents and their dependents living in Tanzania must have either of the following documents: residents permit Class A,B or C; exemption certificate; temporary pass attached with
- Government receipt plus acknowledgement letter; and Diplomatic passport or ID
- EAC citizen refers to the nationals of Tanzania, Kenya,
 Uganda, Burundi, Rwanda and South Sudan
- Nationals of other EAC member states must produce their passport at entry gate
- EAC private vehicles are strictly prohibited to conduct any tourism business in the park
- For video shooting consult Park Management for guidance



Please remember to:

- Leave the Park Undisturbed by not leaving, introducing or removing anything, animate or in animate.
- Use only designated roads/routes/trails.
- Trash in and Trash out.
- Be considerate to fellow visitors do not disturb them or the animals they are watching.
- Obtain an entry permit from the Park. The permit is valid for 24 hours (single entry) and fees once paid cannot be refunded
- Deal with properly registered tour companies that nhave a current/valid TALA Licence.

Please do not:

- Exceed the speed limit of 50 k.p.h. the recommended speed for game viewing is 25 k.p.h.
- Light or cause a wildfire.
- Disturb the wild animals in any way.
- Take any pets or fire arms into the park.
- Uproot, pick, cut, damage any plant or be in possession of any part of a plant from the park.
- Make noise, blow your horn and use radios during game viewng.
- Feed wild animals
- Drive off Road

NOTE: The park opens at 06:00 am and closes at 7:00 pm
