

SAADANI NATIONAL PARK






We are delighted that you have selected to visit this amazing National Park where the bush meets the beach. One gets to relish the palm trees as they sway in a cooling ocean breeze. White sand and blue water sparkle alluring beneath the tropical sun makes Saadani a splendid place to visit.

It is a place where you will encounter large and small mammals, birds and reptiles including Roosevelt's sable antelope; the mangrove forests around the winding Wami river, ocean, clumps of palm trees, coral reefs and the beaches along





Brief History of the Park

Gazetted in 2005 with an area of 1100km², the Park is situated at the heart of the Bagamoyo, Pangani and Zanzibar towns that once was the market place for slave trade.



Getting there

By road: The park can be reached by road network from Dares-salaam via Bagamoyo to Gama/wami entrance gate (131km). Also from Tanga via Pangani and Mkwaja to Madete entance gate (146 km) and from Dar-es-salam/chalinze via miono to Mvave entrance gate (225km). Morever the park can be accessed from Arusha to Madete entrance gate via Mkata (79km).

By Air: Charter flights from Dar-es-salaam, Zanzibar, Tanga or Arusha can land to Saadani airstrip.



Climate

The Park receives a bimodal pattern with rainfall peaks from March to June and short ones from October to November. From June to september and january to February are the best time to visit with average maximum temperatures reaching up to 29c.

Attractions

The Park is home to a variable mix of both marine and mainland flora and fauna most notably waterbucks, giraffes, warthogs, hartebeests, elephants, hippos, crocodiles, water birds. Also the superb scenic beauty of marine - terrestrial interface and the natural Mafui sandbank.

Wami River

Wami River passes through Saadani and empties into the indian ocean. It hosts a large population of hippos, crocodiles, flamingos and many water bird species. Plan to see the Elephants bathing and playing in wami river especially on the early hours of the morning.





Mangrove forest

Saadani will provide you with an opportunity to see a a varied types of mangroves forest found on the saline water/mud and higher ground of the ocean. These salt tolerant tidal forests will give you an exclusive taste of many animal species including the interesting fiddler crab and prawns.

Green Turtles

Madete beach adds an ingredient to your safari that will make it a memorable one. This is where you will be able to see the green turtle breeding site and hatching of the young ones.



Tourism Activities

The Park has a wide range of activities that cater for every ones interest.

· Boat Safari

One can do boat Safari at the delta of Wami river and the ocean. Boat safaris are relaxing and enjoyable. There is a chance you can spot hippos, crocodiles and many birds and it is interesting to watch the vegetation along the banks of the Wami River change with decreasing salinity of water as you move up the river. Boat safaris is also the best selection to see marine and riverine birds like kingfisher and lesser flamingos.



Visit Mafui sand bank

This magical island that opens early morning and day and closes in the evening is the best place where lunch and sun bathing can give you maximum relaxation.

Bird Watching

Birding in Saadani is all year around. Migratory birds from Europe and Northern Africa can be found in November to April making this the best time for bird watching. This is also a nesting season for resident birds and many can be spotted in their breeding plumage.

Walking Safari

Walking safari on natural trails of saadani gets you close to nature and immerse in active game watching. Once you set foot into the vast plains, walk through the thick canopies or landscapes, there is an overwhelming sense of becoming one with nature. You will experience the real thrill as you get to see animals that you may not see when driving.

Most walking safaris are ideal in the morning or just before dusk. Depending on the age group, you can enjoy gentle strolls up to two hours, half day or full day excursion.

Game drive

This activity will reward you with glimpse of elephants, hippos, lions, giraffe, zebra, warthog, buffalo, leopard, hyenas to mention a few.

• Mafui Sand Bank

Visit Mafui sand bank island that opens during the day and closes in the evening, a sand bank where you snorkel in the caves with colourful fish and green turtles. A place where lunch and sun bathing can can give you maximum relaxation





Available tourism facilities

The Park offers various types of accommodation facilities for visitors who visit the Park. These includes rest house (fully furnished and is just close to the beach), Tourists Cottages (bandaz), Special Campsites and Public campsites.

S. Multiple entry in the park

There shall be two multiple entries in the Park where entry fees shall apply

- i. Day-trip permit, which is valid for twelve daylight hours and allows multiple entries within such validity period.
- ii. A sleep-over permit which is valid for twenty-four hours and allows multiple entries within such validity period.

- Payments are done by VISA and MASTER Credit & Debit cards, MPesa, TigoPesa and Airtel Money
- Holders of Directors Pass are not allowed to be accompanied by visitors.
- Expatriates can pay equivalent in Tanzanian shillings.
- Proof of identification is required before entry into the park.
- Payments once done are nonrefundable.



Park Rules and Regulations

Please do not:

- Litter
- Kill, harass, disturb or feed any wild animals in the Park
- Enter the park without a valid permit
- Ignite wildfires
- Erect, mark or remove any signboard in the Park
- Enter or leave the Park at points other than the official entry/ exit gates stipulated in your permit
- Camp at the designated campsites only
