
Welcome to Saaanane Island National Park!

Welcome to Saanane, a Park that is located on an island in the Lake Victoria. It's the only National Park within the city limits. The wildlife here includes Impala, Zebra, Wildebeest Klipspringer, Rock Hyrax, Vervet Monkeys, Dikdik, Otters, Crocodiles and a mixture of indigenous and introduced species. The habitat is of granite boulders, grassy areas, thorny thicket and woodland. There are several reed beds and large trees around the island's shores.

There is also an enclosed lion's den with huge boulders and trees where a lion and lioness live in love! Peacocks are living in another enclosure on the island.

The main feature of the Park is a set of pathways and trails, well constructed with rustic granite stones and trimmed verges that wind a path to all corners of the island. There are look out points with wonderful views of the lake and islands, as well as rest points, a camp site, picnic bandas, a canteen, and quiet hidden corners.

Brief history of the park

The island was named after Mzee Saanane Chawandi, a local farmer and fisherman. In 1964 the Govrnment established Tanzania's first ever zoo here. The objective being to promote conservation education and to provide recreation to the people of Mwanza. Established in 2013, Saanane covers an area of 2.18 square kilometers.



Air: Mwanza airport connects with all the major towns and cities of Tanzania, and also most of the safari destinations.

Road and Rail: Mwanza is connected by road and rail to all corners of Tanzania.

Water: People can travel by ship to Mwanza Port from Musoma and Bukoba on Lake Victoria and also from Uganda, and Kenya.

In Mwanza city the Park headquarters are at Capri point just 15 minutes' walk from city center. TANAPA arranges a 5-minute boat ride from there to the **landing jetty on Saanane Island.**

Climate

The Park has a bimodal rainfall with short rains starting from October to January, long rains from February to May and dry season from June to September

The park is located at an altitude between 1134 and 1319 meters with annual average rainfall ranging from 267mm to 1001 mm

Unique area for photo taking, tourist jump and take pictures and provide scenic view of Lake Victoria.


Water Birds

Park Attractions

The park has several attraction ranging from terrestrial to aquatic animals making an ideal place to visit.

Animals

The Island is a home to free roaming mammals such as zebra, impala, rock hyrax, velvet monkey and wild cat.

· Sun-Downing and Sun-Rising

Four sites exist for sun rise/set watching: two for sun-rising and the remaining for sun-downing. This phenomenon creates fascinating object silhouettes across water to look at.

NOTE:

- Conservation and Vehicle fees are for multiple entry
- Fee once paid is non- refundable
- Proof of identification is mandatory at entry gate
- All tariffs are VAT (18%) exclusive
- Expatriates/residents and their dependents living in Tanzania must have either of the following documents: residents permit Class A,B or C; exemption certificate; temporary pass attached with
- Government receipt plus acknowledgement letter; and Diplomatic passport or ID
- EAC citizen refers to the nationals of Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Burundi, Rwanda and South Sudan
- Nationals of other EAC member states must produce their passport at entry gate
- EAC private vehicles are strictly prohibited to conduct any tourism business in the park
- · For video shooting consult Park Management for guidance

Park Rules and Regulations

Please do not:

- Enter the park without a valid permit.
- Block other visitors access, disturb or the animals they are watching.

- Uproot, pick, cut or damage or be in possession of any part of the plant from the park

- Light or cause any wildfire.
- Litter
- Stay only within the designated accommodation facilities.
